

#### Filelist Commands continued


- Delete files:
  - Enter 'ERASE' on the cmd line next to the file you wish to erase
- Copy files:
  - Type 'copy / new\_filename type mode'. This is a useful tool
- Rename files:
  - Type 'rename / new\_file\_info'.
- Important Keys:
  - PF3 Exits from most interactive commands
  - PF7 scrolls the Page Up
  - PF8 scrolls the Page Down
